Contractual Risk Management

Implement thorough contract reviews and ensure all agreements clearly define responsibilities and liabilities. For example, include specific indemnity clauses that transfer risk for certain liabilities, such as agreeing not to hold the contractor responsible for any claims related to your work. Contractors should require subcontractors to provide certificates of insurance for general liability, Workers' Compensation, and auto liability before work begins.

Documentation and Recordkeeping

Maintain detailed records of all project activities, communications, and changes. Use daily project logs to track progress, take timestamped photos of completed work, and retain signed change orders in case disputes arise about the scope of work or delays.

Subcontractor Selection

Carefully vet and select qualified subcontractors with a strong track record. When hiring a subcontractor, check their references, verify state licensing, and ensure they carry adequate insurance coverage for the specific scope of work.

Provide adequate personal protective equipment (PPE) such as hard hats, gloves, safety glasses, and respirators as required. Train all workers on the correct usage of PPE and regularly inspect it for wear or damage.
